SAFETY PROTOCOLS AT A GLANCE

General safety Points

- 2 Masks to be brought to school each day
- Face shield recommended for eating
- Regular 20 second hand washing
- You may wish to bring your own disinfectant wipes
- Detailed entry and exit plans for each grade level have been developed
- No sharing of any stationery items. Spare items available
- Bring your own food and water in no sharing
- All students to remain in the Grade Level bubble at all times
- Designated grade level toilets.
- Maximum of 3 students in the bathroom at any one time
- Lockers distanced 1.5m apart, individually allocated no sharing
- One way traffic flows throughout the school
- Clear signage provided for room capacity and movement
- 1.5m distancing at all times
- Observe distancing when queuing for toilets
- All Staff will be required to wear face masks on campus all times

Entry and Exit of Students

Students should only come to school if they:

- Are fully registered for 2020-21
- Have proof of an up to date negative Covid-19 test for 12 years and over
- Are healthy and showing no symptoms of illness
- Have a designated on site day
- Observe all signage and social distancing on entry
- All students temperature checked on entry
- Parents and other visitors should not come on onsite during school hours, except to designated drop off/pick up zone and then only one parent per family.
- If Parents or students coming after school, they should make an appointment in advance.
- A declaration will be sent to families and is required to be completed

A dedicated COVID-19 Taskforce has been formed to oversee the guidelines and protocols

Entry and Exit Points

We will be using the following entry and exit points across the school

- Gate 1- Administration Office Grade 10-12 only
- Gate 2- Secondary school rear entrance Secondary School only
- Gate 3-Primary school Primary School Only
- Gate 4-Early Learning centre ELC and Prep entry only
- Gate 5-Community centre- Primary School only

All the gates will be manned by security and students will be directed to Temperature testing zones at each entrance as per below. (Thermal testing)

- Gate 1- Reception area
- Gate 2- Innovation centre
- Gate 3-Primary school office reception
- Gate 4-Early Learning centre reception
- Gate 5-Community centre-Primary centre gymnasium

IMPORTATION

Only one parent/guardian is allowed to enter the school grounds for a maximum period of 10 minutes during the designated drop off and pick-up times

Each parent/guardian must wear a mask, pass through the safety checkpoint, maintain safe social distancing and remain outside at all time

TEACHING AND LEARNING IN THE PRIMARY SCHOOL AND ELC

For the first five (5) weeks, students will have a staggered timetable and a shortened school day.

On-site students will receive blended learning. A mix of face to face and distance learning building on our approach from Term 3.

Those students with appropriate reasons who choose distance learning, will be provided with a balance of live learning (synchronous) and offline learning (asynchronous).

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL AND ELC

- All staff must present a negative Covid-19 PCR test before commencing onsite
- Every student will have their own dedicated and personalised table/space, chair, workbooks and stationery
- Student chairs, learning spaces and social distancing will be at a minimum of 1.5 metres
- Hand sanitizer, soap and disposable paper towel will be in every classroom
- The closure and removal of all water filters and drink taps
- ELC and Prep (KG2) students will be placed in controlled groups of a maximum of 10
- Staff and Grade 1 to Grade 5 students are required to wear a mask at school and on the bus
- All students are encouraged to wear a face shield during eating times
- Explicit lessons will be delivered on safe practices including handwashing, sanitizer and social distancing on a consistent basis
- Opportunities for students to wash and sanitize their hands throughout the day and before any eating time
- Hourly spot sanitizing of key surfaces and high touch points, an end of day sterilization process and a weekly deep clean
- A strict policy of 'if unwell, stay at home'

FROM THE HEAD OF SECONDARY

Dear Students and Parents

We are delighted to be welcoming you the secondary school for the start of the 2020/21 academic year. All of you, whether you are new to VISS or have been part of our community for many years, will have faced the challenges of distance learning during the period when schools were closed last term. I am very proud of the way that our team prepared and delivered and for the way our students embraced the new way of learning.

While we have really missed having 'normal' school and, like everyone else, can't wait for things to return to pre-COVID times, there is a long way to go. Knowing this, the Leadership team began initial preparations for reopening back in May. This meant that, while the official SPEA guidance only came out two weeks ago, we have been planning and preparing our spaces, documentation and protocols and training up our staff so that we can open for as many of the students as want to return to school the week after next. We are required by SPEA to stagger year groups in the five-week transition period, which is a very sensible strategy. We also understand that some families have concerns, notwithstanding the strict social distancing and sanitisation protocols required.

Although I firmly believe that the best place to learn is at school, we will continue to support our students that have to learn from home (and also understand that at any time the school may need to revert to distance learning due to wider issues with COVID). Our utmost priority is the safety of our students, parents and staff and we are lucky to have such an excellent facility to support us with our plan.

Our summer has been busy and, of course, few people have travelled, but it has been worth it to ensure that we can welcome our students to VISS in the coming weeks. We will continue to send information about the restart and as things unfold, but if you have any questions, do please let us know through the normal channels. I very much look forward to seeing our students back on site and hope this message finds you and your families well.

TEACHING AND LEARNING IN THE SECONDARY SCHOOL

Please remember that students will only be able to come to school if:

- Are fully registered for 2020-21
- Have proof of an up to date negative COVID test
- Are healthy and showing no symptoms of illness
- Have a designated on-site day



VISS Secondary school is eager to welcome students back into the classroom after this long break. Students have a rich learning experience in a physical classroom through inspiring interactions with their peers and teachers.

However, in this challenging context we are acutely aware that some students may take longer than others to feel comfortable to return to the classroom. To that end, staff at VISS are committed to provide high quality teaching and learning experiences for both students, those who choose to return to the physical classroom and those who choose to return to the virtual classroom from home.

To facilitate ease of access through a central place for teaching and learning resources and collaboration, all curriculum delivery will be via OneNote for grades 6 to 12.

Students should have received an invitation to join their OneNote class notebook via their school email address for each of their classes by **Thursday 27 August 2020**

Learning from Home

Students working from home will have access to exactly the same content and teacher instruction that students working in school will have access to. Students will access the same OneNote class notebook that students working in school will access. 15 minutes prior to the lesson starting, teachers will post a link to zoom for the lesson on Edmodo

Teachers will screen share the OneNote class notebook content library, so that students working from home can view this content through zoom. As the additional digital content is added to the content library over the course of the lesson, students will be able to view this via zoom. Students working from home will be able to hear what the teacher is saying through zoom, just as they would last term when working remotely. Should students require assistance, they will be able to unmute themselves and ask for assistance via the zoom platform. At the conclusion of the lesson, students will photograph the work that they have completed and upload this to their own digital workbook within their OneNote class notebook so that the teacher can give relevant feedback.

Any assessments that are undertaken will be in a digital format.

Learning in School

Students learning in school will access the curriculum via their OneNote class notebook. Teachers will post explicit teaching content in the content library. As the lesson progresses teachers will add content to the content library. All content that is added will be in a digital form.

Students will be able to view new content as it is added either through their device or on the digital whiteboard in the classroom. Students that require assistance with the content will be able to ask questions of the teacher directly and they will provide this assistance whilst observing appropriate social distancing measures.

At the conclusion of the lesson, students will photograph the work that they have completed and upload this to their own digital workbook within their OneNote class notebook so that the teacher can give relevant feedback. Any assessments that are undertaken will be in a digital format.



SECONDARY TRANSITION SCHEDULE FOR FIRST 3 WEEKS

In line with SPEA guidelines, our gradual transition of students working on site is below.

Sunday 30 August will be the first day for students in Grades 6, 8, 10 and 12. These students will be expected to be in homegroup at 8.30 and will be guided thereafter. Classes for these students will commence in period 3. Students in Grades 7, 9 and 11 will be at home preparing to begin school the following day. This is to ensure students who are on site are fully supported to gradually transition back to school.

Monday 31 August will be the first day for students in Grades 7, 9 and 11. These students will be expected to be in homegroup at 8.30 and will be guided thereafter. Students in Grades 6, 8, 10 and 12 will have some preparation time in the morning. Formal classes for all Secondary students will commence in period 3 on Monday.

The schedules below are for the first 3 weeks of school, Weeks 4 and 5 schedules will be communicated at the end of Week 2 when we have undertaken a full review of our safety procedures.

TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT



A Parent or guardian must be with the children in ELC and Primary school at bus departure for Temperature check prior to boarding bus by Bus Conductor. We suggest checking your child's temperature prior to leaving home.



Social distancing on the bus will be enforced, there will be a "DO NOT USE" sticker to indicate non seating areas



Sanitiser will be available on all buses



Each student boarding the bus will have there temperature taken at the door by the conductor If the temperature is higher than 37.5C they will **NOT** be permitted to board the bus


